



## 2012 DC Physical Activity for Youth Recipients

**Capitol Hill Montessori at Logan** – purchased equipment (climbing wall, basketballs, ), start a Girls on the Run chapter

**Center City** – (six campuses) – used funds to defray the cost of a Playworks coach at each campus. Playworks coach held daily active recess and several longer weekly sessions.

**DC Bilingual** – supported salary of PE teacher to develop PE curriculum for PE class as well as incorporate physical activity into the classroom.

**EW Stokes** – Salary of Wellness Coordinator, to develop activities and train teachers to integrate physical activity into the classroom. Also purchased some equipment, such as jump ropes, balls, mats, cones.

**Excel Academy** – Purchased the KidFit curriculum, which includes a one-year site license and materials such as balance beams, rhythm sticks, scarves, wobble boards, tumbling mats, balls, bean bags, cds and cd players.

**KIPP Key Academy** – partnered with CityDance to teach after school dance classes – ballet, hip hop/Afrofusion.

**National Collegiate Prep** – after school traveling basketball team and cheerleading squad. They paid their coaches, paid transportation, supplies and equipment.

**Savoy Elementary** – Building Our Kids Success (BOKS)- this is a before-school program, and the funding allowed them to expand from 3 mornings to 5 mornings. They used the funds to hire trainers for the sessions.

**SEED Public Charter School** – Used the funds to purchase Wii's and integrate technology into their PE curriculum. They also purchased treadmills. SEED is a boarding school; thus, students have access to the machines during the evening.

**Thurgood Marshall Academy** – started a swimming program and used the funds to pay transportation to swimming pools and a swim instructor.

**Tree of Life** - Purchased equipment and supported PE teacher in training of teachers in brain breaks and other ways to integrate physical activity.

**Two Rivers** – partnered with the YMCA to offer “Wellness Wednesdays,” during which time students visited the YMCA to participate in activities such as swimming, rock climbing, and running.

**Washington Yu Ying** – paid the partial salary of a PE teacher to be able to offer more health and PE classes to all students.
